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THE CLIMATE QUIZ PRIZE COMPETITION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

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1. The Promoter

The Promoter is: the Institute and Faculty of Actuaries of Level 2, Exchange Crescent, 7 Conference Square, Edinburgh, EH3 8RA. **All final submissions to be sent to mathsweekscotland@actuaries.org.uk only.**

2. The competition

2.1 The title of the competition is The Climate Quiz.

2.2 In this 3-part challenge, mathematical problems are given to reveal the issues and consequences of climate change. The activity is designed for Scottish students currently studying maths in S3-S5, however, we welcome applications from all students under the age of 18. The activity is hosted on a webpage and can easily be accessed on any wifi-connected device. There are 2 rounds of 10 multiple choice questions with a final single submission. Participants are only eligible for the final round after they have completed the first two.

3. How to enter

3.1 The competition will run from 9.00am on 28 September 2020 (the "**Opening Date**") to 11:59pm on 30 October 2020 (the "**Closing Date**") inclusive.

3.2 All competition entries must be received by the Promoter at the address set out at condition 1 by no later than 11:55pm on the Closing Date. All competition entries received after the Closing Date are automatically disqualified.

3.3 To enter the competition:

(a) Visit <https://www.mathsweek.scot/activities> to enter the multiple choice rounds.

(b) Details of the final submission will be sent following completion of the first two rounds.

3.4 No purchase necessary and there is no charge to register for use of the website.

3.5 The Promoter will **not** accept:

(a) responsibility for competition entries that are lost, mislaid, damaged or delayed in transit, regardless of cause, including, for example, as a result of any postal failure, equipment failure, technical malfunction, systems, satellite, network, server, computer hardware or software failure of any kind; or

- (b) proof of transmission as proof of receipt of entry to the competition.
- 3.6 By submitting a competition entry, you are agreeing to be bound by these terms and conditions.

- 3.9 The multiple choice rounds are automatically judged via the platform that the competition is hosted. The final submission will be judged by a panel of judges made up of representatives of the Promoter, based on the most apt and original answer to the tie-break question. The decision of the panel of judges (acting reasonably) will be final.
- 3.10 The Promoter will send the full names of the judges to anyone who writes within one month after the Closing Date of the competition requesting details of the judges who email [**mathsweekscotland@actuaries.org.uk**](mailto:mathsweekscotland@actuaries.org.uk)

4. Eligibility

- 4.1 The competition is open to students resident in Scotland who are currently studying maths in S3-S5, however, we'd welcome applications from all students under the age of 18, **except:**
 - (a) employees of the Promoter or its holding or subsidiary companies;
 - (b) employees of agents or suppliers of the Promoter or its holding or subsidiary companies, who are professionally connected with the competition or its administration; or
 - (c) members of the immediate families or households of (a) and (b) above.
- 4.2 In entering the competition, you confirm that you are eligible to do so and eligible to claim any prize you may win. The Promoter may require you to provide proof that you are eligible to enter the competition.
- 4.3 The Promoter will not accept competition entries that are:
 - (a) automatically generated by computer;
 - (b) completed by third parties or in bulk;
 - (c) illegible, have been altered, reconstructed, forged or tampered with;
 - (d) photocopies and not originals; or

(e) incomplete.

- 4.4 There is a limit of one entry per person. Entries on behalf of another person will not be accepted and joint submissions are not allowed.
- 4.5 The Promoter reserves all rights to disqualify you if your conduct is contrary to the spirit or intention of the prize competition.
- 4.6 Competition entries cannot be returned.

5. The prize

- 5.1 The prizes available to be won are 1st Place £200, 2nd Place £100 and 3rd Place £50.
- 5.2 The Promoter reserves the right to replace the prize with an alternative prize of equal or higher value if circumstances beyond the Promoter's control makes it necessary to do so.
- 5.3 The prizes is not negotiable or transferable.
- 5.4 Winners will be contacted by email with details of how to claim their prize.

6. Winners

- 6.1 The decision of the judges nominated by the Promoter is final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into.
- 6.2 The Promoter will contact the winner personally as soon as practicable after the Announcement Date, using the email address provided with the competition entry. The Promoter will not amend any contact information once the competition entry form has been submitted.
- 6.3 The Promoter must either publish or make available information that indicates that a valid award took place. To comply with this obligation the Promoter will publish the name and school of major prize winners and, if applicable, their winning entries on the promoter's website.
- 6.4 If you object to any or all of your name, school and winning entry being published or made available, please contact the Promoter **mathweekscotland@actuaries.org.uk**. In such circumstances, the Promoter must still provide the information and winning entry to the Advertising Standards Authority on request.

7. Claiming the prize

- 7.1 Please refer to the details of how to claim in **Error! Bookmark not defined.**5. If you do not claim the prize by the date set out by the Promoter, your claim will become invalid.
- 7.2 The prize may not be claimed by a third party on your behalf.
- 7.3 The Promoter will make all reasonable efforts to contact the winner. If the winner cannot be contacted or is not available, or has not claimed their prize within 30 days of the Announcement Date, the Promoter reserves the right to offer the prize to the next eligible entrant selected from the correct entries that were received before the Closing Date.
- 7.4 The Promoter does not accept any responsibility if you are not able to take up the prize.

8. Limitation of liability

Insofar as is permitted by law, the Promoter, its agents or distributors will not in any circumstances be responsible or liable to compensate the winner or accept any liability for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a result of taking up the prize except where it is caused by the negligence of the Promoter, its agents or distributors or that of their employees. Your statutory rights are not affected.

9. Ownership of competition entries and intellectual property rights

- 9.1 All competition entries and any accompanying material submitted to the Promoter will become the property of the Promoter on receipt and will not be returned.
- 9.2 By submitting your competition entry and any accompanying material, you agree to:
- (a) assign to the Promoter all your intellectual property rights with full title guarantee; and
 - (b) waive all moral rights,

in and to your competition entry and otherwise arising in connection with your entry to which you may now or at any time in the future be entitled under the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 as amended from time to time and under all similar legislation from time to time in force anywhere in the world.

- 9.3 You agree that the Promoter may, but is not required to, make your entry available on its website <https://www.actuaries.org.uk/> and any other media, whether now known or invented in the future, and in connection with any publicity of the competition. You agree to grant the Promoter a non-exclusive, worldwide, irrevocable licence, for the full period of any intellectual property rights in the competition entry and any accompanying

materials, to use, display, publish, transmit, copy, edit, alter, store, re-format and sublicense the competition entry and any accompanying materials for such purposes.

10. Data protection and publicity

11. General

- 11.1 If there is any reason to believe that there has been a breach of these terms and conditions, the Promoter may, at its sole discretion, reserve the right to exclude you from participating in the competition.
- 11.2 The Promoter reserves the right to hold void, suspend, cancel, or amend the prize competition where it becomes necessary to do so.
- 11.3 These terms and conditions shall be governed by English law, and the parties submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.
